The long awaited concert, *Folk Songs from Around the World* is on July 11<sup>th</sup>, followed by Bach's *St John Passion* on October 7<sup>th</sup>, in conjunction with the Windfire Chamber Choir sponsored by Music at the Basilica. The annual Christmas concert details are not yet to hand.

The Chorale committee decided not to hold the usual full day rehearsal in January as originally planned. Rehearsals resumed on Monday January 31 at 7.30pm at St Luke's Uniting Church, Highton. (This decision was made in respect of the current case numbers of COVID-19 in the community, and the restrictions this imposes such as wearing masks, not using crockery and cutlery for lunch, and also definitions of social and close contacts which could impose work restrictions for some if anyone tested positive.

Hello fellow singers! Like some other groups in our Choral Grapevine, Geelong Harmony Chorus managed to keep most of our members singing during these last two pandemic years, despite the restrictions. This was due in no small part to our talented and very determined Musical Director, Alex Morris, and our Assistant Musical Directors, Michelle Roy and Emily Moriarty, and ... Zoom!

Love it or hate it, Zoom has been key to a huge part of our chorus interactions. As a group, we pride ourselves on being pro-active to all COVID restrictions, but believe us, we positively lunged at any opportunity for in-person rehearsals whenever restrictions permitted. We sang out, duly masked, in the open air or in our meticulously spaced open-doored (freezing!), QR-coded rehearsal hall. Even when we can rehearse in person, we continue to offer Zoom upon request to those members who prefer to maintain their distance but who want to be a part of the rehearsal. Most members though are eager to attend and enjoy each other's company and our voices and our beautiful harmonies!

With most gigs cancelled in 2021, we didn't hesitate when any easing of restrictions permitted us to sing in small groups at some Citizenship Ceremonies or even do carol singing at Market Square for Christmas. Our end of year Christmas party at Geelong Yacht Club saw us put on a small, mostly impromptu show for family and friends on the gorgeous lawn area with the bay and the yachts as our backdrop.

If we have learnt anything from two years in chorus lockdown, it's that people really want to be able to sing. Throughout the year, we had enquiries from people about joining us but put them on hold in the belief that we needed to be out of lockdown to provide newbies with the full Geelong Harmony Chorus experience – but now we believe that we can welcome new members regardless of whether rehearsals are online or in person. So the plan for 2022 is to welcome new singers wherever we are – starting now!

The next few weeks will see us continuing to perform in small group, and there is the very real possibility that many of us will head over to Adelaide for a Sweet Adelines Australia festival-style convention in May. Other things on our 2022 agenda include a retreat in August (postponed three times in eight months) and a show at the Potato Shed in October 2022, and by the year's end, fulfilling our range of Christmas performances.

We are welcoming new singers – particularly those with a low alto range but other voice parts are welcome too – who want to take their harmony singing to a new level to join us. Of course, our idea will be reviewed as we go along and any necessary changes be made to suit all concerned.

We plan to work on repertoire for a recording. We have received a grant from our local shire to help cover the costs of this. We tried starting work on this last year until lock downs make it impossible so we shall take up this project again and keep working on that.

#### **BALLARAT CHORAL SOCIETY**

We started back as a choir very cautiously in September 2021, rehearsing in a well-ventilated space, with choristers seated 2 metres apart, and all singers wearing masks. Practice times were shortened to 20 minutes at a time, with at least 10 minutes between sessions, during which time, the practice space was well ventilated with strong fans. We have now purchased a Co2 meter, which has assisted us in monitoring the indoor air quality.

Of course, we have also insisted on all choristers being double vaccinated in order to sing in the Choir and are encouraging people to get the booster shot as soon as possible in order to obtain maximum protection.

We have recommenced rehearsals for 2022 and are preparing for a number of concerts, potentially in collaboration with other music groups in Ballarat. Our first event will be in late May/early June, at which time we will be performing Haydn's 'Little Organ' Mass along with a selection of other classical

music from the late 18th Century. We are still working on our performance schedule for our second concert. However, our last concert for 2022 will be with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra and Chorus who have invited us to sing with them when they visit Ballarat for a performance of Handel's Messiah on December 14th. We are so excited to break able to join forces with them again.

#### **TIDES OF WELCOME**

Current guidelines require us to either sing inside with masks on or sing outdoors without masks but using social distancing. We are excited to announce that we have secured the hiring of the **Ocean Grove Pavilion** in Ingemala Park. This will enable the entire choir to rehearse safely.

We have over ten people on our waiting list but due to Covid we have decided not to draw upon it as it's far easier to cater for our 24 or so given current restrictions and the promise that one day we will return to our home base of Queenscliff Neighbourhood House.

Wayne Jury, our choir director, has been working with Sarah Carroll and together have been preparing us for the *Water Bearer Project* (an initiative in Geelong) which involved translating one of Sarah's songs into Wathaurung language. In addition to this the same song is being translated into a Canadian indigenous language Mi'gmag for a choir to perform as well. Choir rehearsals started in February, working towards recordings from March 1<sup>st</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> and projections on film in Geelong from April 8<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup>.

**Shedding the Blues** [local men's music group] have funding for a music event day called Tune-Up on Sunday afternoon April 10th. We have been invited to perform for around half an hour. Other performances will be showcased and it is a free event.
