THE GISBORNE SINGERS

The Gisborne Singers' initiative, the inaugural *Symphonia Choralis* held in December last year was a great success. The choral festival attracted four other choirs who each performed their own repertoire on the Saturday and many choristers joined *The Gisborne Singers* and the *Bendigo Symphony Orchestra* in their performance of Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony* on the Sunday. Held at the Ulumbarra Theatre in Bendigo, this was the first time this great symphony had been performed in Bendigo and the packed house responded with rapturous applause. Artistic Director of both *The Gisborne Singers* and the *BSO*, Luke Severn was conductor, and guest soloists included the choir's artistic patron Merlyn Quaife (soprano), Kristen Leich (mezzo soprano), Michael Petruccelli (tenor) and Teddy Tahu Rhodes (baritone).

This year, the choir is in the process of undertaking Mozart's *Requiem* in late April and early May. The stellar line-up of soloists from the Beethoven joins the Singers again with orchestral backing from the Macedon Ranges Chamber Orchestra. Venues included the brand-new auditorium at St Mary's Worship Centre in Sunbury on Sunday April 30 and the traditional bluestone church Our Lady of the Rosary in Kyneton on Sunday May 7.

On Saturday 10 June, The Gisborne Singers will take part in Woodend Winter Arts Festival's inaugural Choral Marathon. We have an indoors then an outdoors bracket between 3:30 and 4:30pm, followed by participation with seven other choirs in the Big Sing Flash Mob as part of WWAF's first High Street Festa. 50% of Choral Marathon ticket sales will go to the choir nominated by the ticket buyer.

Plans for later in the year include a winter Cabaret, Brahms *Liebeslieder Waltzes* (4 hand piano and choir) in October at the Church of the Resurrection in Macedon and a Christmas Service of Carols, in December in Kyneton.

VOX ANGELICA GEELONG CHAMBER CHOIR

Vox Angelica Geelong Chamber Choir has its first concert on Sunday 7th of May in the Geelong Gallery at 6pm. Giving a concert in this beautifully resonant space has been an annual event now for several years. This year we were invited to give a concert as part of the stunning exhibition of the paintings of Melbourne artist, Clarice Beckett (1887 to 1935), and we will perform surrounded by her luminous canvasses. The exhibition and concert are entitled "Atmosphere", and the music was chosen to reflect the senses of calm, clarity, quietness, intimacy, melancholy,

transcendence, and the subjects of morning, evening, light, rain- among other senses and subjects! We commissioned a work from Geelong's own Kym Alexandra Dillon, who has written an arresting and superbly atmospheric composition, scored for nine parts and using Beckett's own words reflecting on her approach to painting. In addition, the 27 strong choir is singing works by Parry ("Never Weatherbeaten Sail"), Calvin Bowman, Kate Rusby, Randall Thompson, Stanford's "The Bluebird", and others. We finish with Latvian composer Ēriks Ešenvalds' haunting "There Will Come Soft Rains".

The concert is sold out but will be repeated at **5pm, Sunday 17th of September** in the lovely acoustic of St Paul's Anglican Church, LaTrobe Terrace. We will also sing excerpts from the programme at the Jam for Refugees on Saturday 28th of October (11am) at St Paul's.

A letter from our founder

I'm honoured to publish a letter from the founder and first compiler of the Choral Grapevine, June Roberts.

To the Choral Grapevine in 2023 - I have been thrilled to see the development of CGV since 2013 under Helen's expert leadership.
